## QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION:

1. What stood out to you most from the message?
2. What is something that has stood out to you from your own reading of Luke? Could you share an observation you have written in your journal?
3. Have you ever experienced “identity theft”? What would you do if you did?
4. What difference does it make, in general, to know “who you are”?
5. The Father speaks over the Son and all of His children: “You are my child. I love you. I delight in you.” What difference does it make to know and believe this?
6. Who do you need to tell: “I love you. I delight in you.” What difference does it make when we communicate that kind of acceptance to one another?
7. Read Ephesians 1:3-14. How many parts of your identity in Christ can you find in these verses? List out each one you can find.
8. Of the identities you listed, which one or two is most meaningful to you today? Why?
9. What are some specific lies that Christians are often tempted to believe? What truth can you use to fight each lie?
10. Spend some time praying for one another to know and stand in your identity in Christ.
