## QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

- 1. What stood out to you most from the message?
- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1-3. What strikes you most about the idea that without love, we have nothing?
- 3. Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-8. Which quality can you specifically commend in someone else that you are with or that you can think of? Which quality do you believe you most need to grow in?
- 4. Read 1 John 3:16. As you think of Jesus' example in laying down his life, what other examples do you see in the world today where people are laying down their lives for others?
- 5. Read 1 John 4:16-21. What stands out to you in these verses? In your own words, explain what it means that "God is love."
- 6. Jesus ministered to zealots, tax collectors, Samaritans, Gentiles, centurions, lepers, and so many more characters. Which character do you think the people of his day were most surprised to see him love, and why? And what do you learn from that?
- 7. Read Romans 14:1-3. In what areas today might we be tempted to judge other believers about things even though God has already accepted us? (Remember, these are not doctrinal issues, but areas the Scriptures don't address directly)
- 8. Read Romans 10:13. What are some ways in which we might cause a brother or sister to stumble if we are not careful?
- 9. Read Romans 15:7. While standing firm in our doctrinal beliefs and biblical values, what are some ways we can grow a culture of acceptance in our church?
- 10. What is one specific thing you can aim to do this week in response to the word you have heard?
