

NEVER FORGET (WORSHIP REMEMBERS)

Luke 17:11-19 | March 14, 21 | Pastor Michael Foster

“People who have seen the glory of God are changed people. They will never be what they were – unless they forget; then they will forsake. If we are willing to look deeply into the glimpses of glory, and not forget, we too will be changed. It won’t disappoint...” - Phil Powers

- Call out to the Master who is rich in mercy (vv. 11-13)
- Trust and obey when it doesn’t make sense (v. 14)
- Remember and return to Jesus (vv. 15-19)

From Psalm 105:1-5:

- Meditate on His works
- Tell others about Him
- Seek his face always

FOR FURTHER REFLECTION

Meditate throughout this series on Psalms 90-106 – especially Psalms 105 and 106 (and 107!) this week!

*As you read these Psalms, consider how our need for God is emphasized, how God is revealed, and what our response to God looks like – the need, the reveal, the response!

Pray throughout this series for...

1. God to show us His glory
2. God to grow us as worshippers who glorify Him in spirit and truth
3. God to lead and provide for our worship ministry

QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

1. What stood out to you most from the message?
2. In your own words, explain how Jesus has “picked you up, turned you around, and set your feet on solid ground!”
3. Consider what was said about worshipping in “spirit and truth” (John 4:23-24). How would you describe this in your own words? Can you share an example of a time when someone you know was truly worshiping in spirit and truth?
4. Imagine the life of a first-century leper. What do you think would have been most difficult?
5. How have you experienced the reality that Jesus is rich in mercy? (Read Ephesians 2:1-5)
6. Can you share an example of a time when you had to trust and obey Jesus when it didn’t make sense? Is there anything Jesus is asking you to do right now that others can pray about for you?
7. What are some specific ways that you are intentional to “remember” Jesus? What does that look like practically for you?
8. Read some of Psalm 105. Why does the psalmist spend so much time reviewing the history of Israel? What can we learn from this?
9. Are you sure today that you have been saved by Jesus and not merely helped or healed by him? How do you know? (John 3:16, Ephesians 2:8-9)
10. Who are some people you can prayerfully invite to the “Road to Redemption” outreach? Spend some time praying for them!
