Eggs

One

Palm Branch

Matthew 21:8-9

⁸Many people spread clothes in the road, while others put down branches which they had cut from trees. ⁹Some people walked ahead of Jesus and others followed behind. They were all shouting, "Hooray for the Son of David! God bless the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hooray for God in heaven above!"

Two

Bread

Matthew 26:26

During the meal Jesus took some bread in his hands. He blessed the bread and broke it. Then he gave it to his disciples and said, "Take this and eat it. This is my body."

Three

Silver Coins

Matthew 27:3

Judas had betrayed Jesus, but when he learned that Jesus had been sentenced to death, he was sorry for what he had done. He returned the thirty silver coins to the chief priests and leaders

Four

Rope (Whip) Mark 15:15

Pilate wanted to please the crowd. So he set Barabbas free. Then he ordered his soldiers to beat Jesus with a whip and nail him to a cross.

Five

Purple Cloth and Thorns Matthew 27:28-29

²⁸They stripped off Jesus' clothes and put a scarlet robe on him. ²⁹They made a crown out of thorn branches and placed it on his head, and they put a stick in his right hand. The soldiers knelt down and pretended to worship him. They made fun of him and shouted, "Hey, you king of the Jews!"

Six

Cross John 19:17

And he carried his cross to a place known as "The Skull." ¹⁷ In Aramaic this place is called "Golgotha."

Seven

Nails Mark 15:24

They nailed Jesus to a cross and gambled to see who would get his clothes.

Eight

Sign Mark 15:26

On it was a sign that told why he was nailed there. It read, "This is the King of the Jews."

Nine

Sponge and Spear John 19:29, 33-34

²⁹A jar of cheap wine was there. Someone then soaked a sponge with the wine and held it up to Jesus' mouth on the stem of a hyssop plant. ³³But when they came to Jesus, they saw that he was already dead, and they did not break his legs. ³⁴One of the soldiers stuck his spear into Jesus' side, and blood and water came out.

Ten

Spices John 19:40

The two men wrapped the body in a linen cloth, together with the spices, which was how the Jewish people buried their dead.

Eleven

Stone John 20:1

On Sunday morning while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance.

Twelve

Nothing Luke 24:6-7

‘Jesus isn’t here! He has been raised from death. Remember that while he was still in Galilee, he told you, ‘The Son of Man will be handed over to sinners who will nail him to a cross. But three days later he will rise to life.’ ”
