QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

1. What stood out to you most from the message?
2. As you think back over our whole series on worship (which included messages on the woman of Luke 7, the Samaritan leper, the cost of following Jesus, Palm Sunday, and Mary and Martha), what are some things you want to remember?
3. Describe a time when you have seen religion used to exploit vulnerable people. How do you think Jesus felt about that situation? (Consider Luke 19:45-46 and 20:45-47)
4. Spend some time reading Matthew 23. What “pharisaical” practices must we be careful to guard against in our giving and serving today? (Consider also Matthew 6:1-4)
5. Share about some of the ways God has worked in your heart as you have trusted Him through your serving and/or giving.
6. Share about your experience of serving in various ministries (in our church or elsewhere). How has God worked in you or through you during those experiences?
7. Read 2 Corinthians 9:6-15. What are some important principles about giving we could draw from this chapter?
8. Read 2 Corinthians 8:1-5. What do the Macedonian churches described in these verses have in common with the widow of Luke 21?
9. Read Philippians 4:19. How does this promise of God encourage your heart as you look to serve and give to the Lord?
10. Spend some time thanking God for the way He has provided for our church through the serving and giving of His people. Ask the Lord to continue to provide!
