### DID WE WIN? by Pastor Mike Foster

"Did we win?" were his first words after waking up. The words weren't spoken – he was still on a ventilator after suffering cardiac arrest – but he wrote them clearly. Three days earlier he made a routine tackle and then dropped to the ground. Millions of viewers of the most anticipated game of the season were told he was given CPR – in front of his horrified teammates, 65,000 other humans, and his mom. The game suddenly meant nothing. "The only thing we care about," everyone echoed, "is Damar Hamlin's life." And then Damar woke up in ICU and asked about the game.

It was a fair question. He had devoted his life to playing in the NFL, loved his teammates, and remembered the high stakes of the game. It was even an encouraging question. As his doctor commented, the question indicated "not only that the lights are on. We know that he's home." But it was also a very naive question – and not just because Damar didn't know the game had been canceled. More significantly, Damar didn't realize how two words in his question had been redefined since his heart stopped. There was a new "win," and a bigger "we."

The "win" was no longer about a game, but life. Not just survival of life, but caring about what matters most in life – which, judging from the way a nation reacted, is not football (not even the playoffs!) or temporal things. People matter – and so we stopped everything to help Damar. Faith matters – and so we prayed, on TV and in living rooms and at hospitals.

And evidently a whole lot of little things matter too – like learning CPR, helping a mother find her son, and toys for underprivileged kids (which will be in surplus after people gave about 9 million dollars to Hamlin's charity in a week). It turns out some little things are pretty big. Life on earth itself is small in span. Psalm 90:10 still rings true: "Our days may come to seventy years, or eighty, if our

strength endures." Damar Hamlin's heart stopped at age 24. And he was in better shape than most of us. The Psalmist writes, "Teach us to number our days, that

we may gain a heart of wisdom" (90:12). There is much wisdom to gain from Damar. Let's live for what matters most.

That's the new "win" (as redefined while Damar was sleeping), but what about the bigger "we?" At kick-off on Monday, Bengals fans shouted their "who dey" chant - "who dey think gonna beat dem Bengals?" A half hour later, there was no more "we" or "dey" - everyone was on Damar's team. Orange and black, red and blue, we are all flesh and bone. Former NFL players spoke that night of a fraternity in the league, highlighting ways in which football colleagues understand and love each other. But the night belonged to humans at large - men, women, and children who worried together, cried together, and held each other.

Fans of every team united, along with people of every party, race, class, and creed. And, notably, we did not look within. We "lifted our eyes to the hills" and remembered "where our help comes from" (Psalm 121). We looked up and called on our Maker. It is, evidently, what we still innately do when we come to an end of ourselves.

It is also what God taught us to do when He became one of us, part of our human fraternity. "Since the children have flesh and blood, He too shared in our humanity" (Hebrews 2:14). "He too" - big little words. He too suffered, He too cried, and His heart also stopped. As one commercial during the game pointed out, "He gets us." He also saves us. Jesus became like us "so that by His death He might destroy him who has the power of death, that is the devil, and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death" (Hebrews 2:15). As a brother, He knew what we most needed. As a Savior, He provided it. He conquered death and now revives the hearts of all who call on Him. Actually, He gives us new hearts that last forever (Ezekiel 36:26).

So, "did we win?" We sure did, Damar. We all won something much bigger than a game. We won an opportunity to regain perspective and renew relationships, including our relationship with God. They say winning is addictive. In this case, let's hope so. Let's keep winning together.

#### Two quick snapshots among the areas I am privileged to serve:



Kids Sunday School: A major praise from this fall is an increase in total workers within our Sunday School. Staffing needs has (and is) a recurring prayer and since Covid we have experienced challenging staffing shortages. Currently, we have about 60 different workers each month including teachers, assistants, and teen helpers! Our classrooms are filling up, and we are usually able to find the workers we need to staff the classroom each week, though it is always a journey of faith watching God provide each Sunday!

Because of the climbing numbers of children and more settled staffing situation, we are now in a place to shift from basic maintenance of the Sunday School ministry to growing the Sunday School department. An example of desired growth is in our 4's/5's class, where we average about 14-18 children per week. It would be ideal to break this into two classes. Doing so would help with classroom management and better equip teachers to reach kids for Jesus, which is made harder in a classroom of this size. We are also in need at the 9:15 service of adding to our infant care roster, and additional support for the 1st-4th grades. Please pray for more workers into this great harvest field!

God is truly blessing the work at Forcey Christian School as we begin our 45<sup>th</sup> year of ministry. Each day 383 students enter our doors and hear the gospel of Jesus Christ. They are discipled and taught by Christian teachers who love God and love their students. I'm honored and blessed to be a part of the mission work that goes on here each day. We are celebrating and thanking God for His favor and blessing so far this year. We have over 100 members in



our newly launched parent teacher organization (PTO). Some are brand new families to Forcey. This parent community is essential to help create a sense of family, belonging, and unity in the faith. The PTO has implemented a new room parent program. Room parents provide support for individual teachers and students and work to bridge the gap between school and home. The PTO has planned some successful fundraisers that do more than raise funds. They provide opportunities for families and students to socialize and fellowship together. This is so needed and welcomed after those difficult Covid years where we were so isolated from each other.

In a year of nationwide teacher shortages, God has blessed us with 5 new teachers this year. Mr. Lawrence, our assistant principal, has launched a new teacher mentoring program. New to FCS teachers are paired with an experienced teacher to offer support, help with transitioning into FCS culture, and provide help with instruction and classroom management strategies. These mentoring opportunities are turning into blessed times of community, support, and care.

Forcey Christian School has a renewed focus this year on service. Another area that took a hit during those Covid years. We are partnering with Image Makers Ministries and have adopted a public school in Baltimore City. It has started with a toy drive but my hope and prayer is that it turns into something much more, allowing the students to do the work of service, and making new friends and partners with the people of this public school community. Ultimately, being able to share the good news and hope of Jesus Christ with these students and their families.

On a personal note, God is stretching my faith and making me into the leader He wants me to be. Many times, I don't see how a situation will resolve, but God is always faithful, God always provides, God always carries me and the school through challenging situations that ultimately bring Him glory and are for the good. I'm trying to pause during those moments and thank Him for being Jehovah Jireh, my provider, and use them as a reminder of God's constant provision, wisdom, favor, and strength for the next challenge. #### WHAT'S NEW with our GLOBAL MINISTRY PARTNERS

For 30+ years, Forcey has partnered with Julius Murgor, a member of the Pokot tribe (population 700,000) in West Kenya. God has used Julius' ministry, POM (Pokot Outreach), to bring thousands to faith in Christ. They have established 3 orphanages, created women's initiatives, and enabled thousands of children to attend school. In 2022 Julius was elected as Member of Parliament (Kenya) and retired from POM. Julius will be succeeded by another Forcey partner, Reuben Meriakol, who has spoken during Forcey services twice in the last 5 years. Reuben is also Pokot; his family was mentored by Julius. Reuben became passionate about serving the Lord and expanded Pokot Outreach to include various tribes in South Sudan. Another Julius, Julius Kaprech, will now oversee evangelistic outreach and discipleship in W. Kenya and part of Uganda.

Please pray for Julius as he represents West Pokot in the Kenyan government, for Reuben as he assumes the role of Director of POM Kenya and S. Sudan, and for Julius Kaprech as POM continues to reach out to new areas.

### PRIORITIES FOR THE NEW YEAR

How to find motivation when it seems impossible.

Resolutions are trendy at the start of the new year. I've always struggled with them because of how "trendy" they can be, but also because they always seem insurmountable and impossible to keep! I tend to really struggle with motivation anyway, and as I have been praying through this struggle God opened my eyes to something. *Resolutions will never stick, habits will never develop, if my priorities are out of line.* So, this year I'm looking to not make *resolutions* but set *priorities*.

If you set your priorities in line, then those changes and resolutions are easier to keep throughout the year. For example, I have a resolution to take care of my physical health. If the priority is my family - being there for them long term - then my health becomes very important, making it easier to have motivation to keep the resolution. Because it's deeper than just *wanting* something - it becomes a *need*.

After setting our priorities in line, then we can set realistic AND lofty goals/resolutions aligned with those priorities! If you don't set lofty goals, then you won't carry on hope for something greater. But if you ONLY set lofty goals and if you don't reach them, then you'll be discouraged. Let us both be hopeful and realistic. Then, lastly, it's time to plan the steps needed to accomplish those goals and dreams. Giving yourself bite-sized steps helps make it feel not quite so impossible.

Throughout 2023, the most important priority should be our relationship with the Lord! With Him at the top of our priority lists - the rest will fall in line. He will give us the grace to endure when our priorities slip, when we misstep, when we don't reach our goals, and He will help us to stay motivated through it all. Above all, prayer, worship, the Word - these will help inform us as we make resolutions, goals, and steps. "Your Word is a lamp for my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105.
