GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. What stood out to you most from the message?
- 2. What did you learn today in general about the Day of Pentecost?
- 3. Share about a time when God opened a door of ministry for you. What are some doors you are praying might open soon?
- 4. Read Acts 5:29 and 1 Peter 2:13-17. In your own words, explain how Christians can obey and apply both of these sayings of Peter.
- 5. Share about a time when you saw God work to open the heart of someone who seemed far from Him. Spend some time praying for God to touch and open more hearts.
- 6. Read 2 Timothy 3:12 and John 16:33. Share about a time when you were criticized or marginalized because of your faith in Christ. How has God been faithful to you in such times?
- 7. Read Hebrews 12:1-3. What can we gain from considering the example of Jesus in these verses?
- 8. Read Acts 5:41-42. What are some things that might stop us from sharing the good news about Jesus? How can we overcome those barriers?
- 9. What would it specifically look like for you to be a little more brave in sharing your faith this week?
- 10. Spend some time praying for people who do not yet know eternal salvation in Christ. (Colossians 4:2-4)
