Peace with God

1. To have peace with God I must have a <u>righteous</u> standing
2. Jesus came so that I could have a <u>righteous</u> standing.
3. Because of Jesus, I now <u>stand</u> in <u>grace</u> .

Peace with God means...

- ✓ My <u>relationship</u> with God is <u>secure</u>.
- ✓ I am motivated by love and not by fear.
- ✓ I can be an ambassador of true peace.

Discussion Questions

- 1. Review: As we continue our Christmas series on "Peace with Us," describe what the Bible means by peace?
- 2. We are by nature enemies of God to receive his wrath due to our sin (Romans 5:9-10). If this is our nature, how then can we find peace with God? (Hint: it's a big theological word that starts with 'j'). Describe.

- 3. What astounds you most about having peace with God?
- 4. How does having peace with God and standing in grace affect how I view *God* when I sin? How does it affect how I view *myself* when I sin?
- 5. How can you describe the benefits of peace with God to friends, relatives, or co-workers whom you encounter who don't know Jesus?
- 6. 1 John 4:18-19 describes how perfect love casts our fear. How does this passage relate to Romans 5:1-2.
- 7. How does having peace with God affect the other categories of peace we experience in our everyday lives such as family peace, inner peace, marital peace, world peace, etc.?
