I. Position Specifics

We are so thankful you are interested in applying to be part of our leadership as an Assistant Director this summer at Forcey Day Camp 2024! Before going any further, please familiarize yourself with the Day Camp ministry and make sure you understand our expectations for staff members. Some of the material is new for 2024.

Qualifications	Must be a growing follower of Christ; Must have a heart to see others come
for Assistant Director	to faith in Christ; Must have attained a sustained reputation of personal godliness; Must have an awareness of strengths and weaknesses and be willing to grow in each area; Must be comfortable and eager to lead a group of staff (mostly teenagers and young adults) in spiritual ministry.
Nature of Ministry at Forcey Day Camp	Our purpose at Forcey Day Camp is to connect campers to Christ. Therefore, sharing Jesus Christ with our campers (aged 5-12) in word and deed is the focus of the ministry. A weekly schedule is followed, with some different activities each week including games, crafts, field trips, swimming, etc. As in 2023, camp will be divided into three sections (K-1 st grade, 2-4th grade, 5-6 th grade campers) and campers will follow a different schedule tailored to their age group. Each staff person will primarily work with one of the three age groups, with each group working as a team to reach its particular campers for the Lord. Counselors lead campers through the day engaging in all activities and taking the opportunities to minister to camper's needs. Assistant Directors functionally lead the counselor staff in the ministry of the camp by providing oversight, support, and spiritual direction.
Nature of Assistant Director Position	Assistant Directors are the program managers of the camp. They lead and direct the camp through the daily schedule, execute "big-picture" camp discipline over assigned campers, lead assigned staff in spiritual ministry, contribute to the overall direction and shaping of the summer program, and hold an "ownership" of the success of the camp program. Precise roles for each Assistant Director will be determined by the FDC Committee upon hire.
Availability	 With only 8 weeks of ministry, each staff member is expected to make camp a priority, and availability will be considered in hiring: Work a regular week during Training Week (week before camps starts) Be available from at least 7:45am – 4:10pm, M-F during the camp season (dates tba), and one to two days/wk until 6:00pm (pre-assigned). One additional 40-hour week (pre-camp and during camp) time is expected. Therefore, assistant directors are a part of the pre-camp preparation and must be ready to prioritize camp activities. Pre-planned time off is possible but the nature of the position requires a commitment to daily participation, and full availability will be strongly considered in hiring. <i>Availability limitations must be explained at the interview</i>. Other availability expectations for the Assistant Director include Family Orientation (6/20 at 7:30pm AND 6/22 at 10:30am), Ministry Commissioning service (TBA), Family Night (8/1 after camp day until approx. 8:30), and a general commitment and flexibility to attend pre-planned staff events.
