GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What stood out to you most from the message?
2. Read Psalm 150 together as a group. How do you see God at the center of the praise in this Psalm?
3. What are we tempted to boast in other than God? How can we guard our hearts and our church and make sure the Lord is always the center of our praise?
4. What role has music played in your walk with the Lord?
5. Read Psalm 35:18, 111:1, and 116:19 along with Psalm 150:1. What is the significance of praising the Lord in the company of his people? What are some ways in which you are blessed by times of corporate worship in the church?
6. What are a few practical ways you can better prepare your heart, mind, and body for corporate worship on Sunday mornings in the coming season?
7. How can you be more intentional to pray for, encourage, and support those who are involved in the worship ministries of Forcey? Who is someone you can encourage this week?
8. What “instruments” has God enabled you to play – if not musical instruments, what are some things God has gifted you in that you can use to glorify him? And how do you plan to serve the Lord with these gifts in the coming season?
9. What is one major takeaway for you from this whole summer in the Psalms? What is something you want to remember from our time in the Psalms?
10. Spend some time praising the Lord together as a group!
