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Group Discussion Guide

➔ Re-read 1 Corinthians 15:58-16:18 together.

1. Summarize the background of Paul's travels and what he is trying to accomplish.
2. What stood out to you from the message?
3. What character traits of a resolute Christian stand out and inspire you from 1 Corinthians 15:58 and 16:13?
4. The recipients of the special collection (vv.1-4) were believers in Jerusalem (mostly Jews) while the Corinthian population was heavily Gentile. What temptations might the Corinthians have faced regarding their generosity? What drives boundaryless generosity?

Personal heart question: *What* moves your money?

5. From vv. 8-9, what makes Paul's decision to stay on at Ephesus so radical? What everyday scenarios in our lives might call forth similar risk-taking?

Personal heart question: How much of your life is *beyond* your comfort-zone?

6. How easily do you quit hard things being done for the Lord? What are some things that cause us to "throw in the towel?"
7. Select one particular application from this passage to seek growth for in your life. Ask for prayer from another, and commit this growth to the Lord.



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
